**Landfill Tax and the Scottish Landfill Communities Fund**

Every tonne of waste that is collected by Landfill Operators (LOs) is subject to Landfill Tax. This tax came into effect in 1996 as a way to encourage Local Authorities and LOs to reuse, reprocess or recycle as much waste as possible before it reaches landfill. The collection of this tax was devolved to Scotland in 2015.

Included in the Landfill Tax Act was the Scottish Landfill Communities Fund (SLCF), a scheme that allows LOs to donate a percentage of their Landfill Tax liability to an enrolled Approved Body. The Approved Body uses this funding to support a wide range of community, heritage and environmental projects in the vicinity of landfill sites through the SLCF.

The SLCF is regulated by SEPA on behalf of Revenue Scotland.
